Update from the International Taskforce on Child Protection February 2025

The International Taskforce on Child Protection calls your attention to the publication of a newly briefing on safeguarding governance within international school communities. This guidance and the accompanying resources have been created and reviewed through the collaboration of dedicated Taskforce volunteers over the past two years.

The <u>International Taskforce on Child Protection (ITFCP) Safeguarding Governance Briefing</u> includes guidance on:

- Governance structures in international schools
- Alignment with the ITFCP Expectations for School Communities 2021
- Providing strategic oversight of safeguarding
- School safeguarding statement
- Appointing a Designated Safeguarding Board Member
- Supporting the development of a safeguarding culture
- Legal responsibilities, obligations and cultural expectations
- The Board's role in overseeing the management of a critical incident

The 2025 Briefing is based on the following principles and the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC):

- ✓ All children have equal rights to be protected from harm and abuse.
- ✓ Everyone has a responsibility to support the protection of children.
- ✓ All schools have a responsibility to build a community that values diversity, equity, and inclusion for each child.
- ✓ All schools have a duty of care to children enrolled in the school and those who are affected by the operations of the school.
- ✓ All actions on child protection are taken with the best interests of the child, which are paramount.
